He's infused us with energy by bringing in a diverse and "talented" freshmen/transfer class, He's granted us times of peace and quiet during our winter retreat, He's raised new leaders to help both at CBS and at other Christian organizations all across campus, He's shown that He is Sovereign by calling many of us back to him or by bringing us to Him for the first time and He even managed to give CBS some of the best looking coordinators ever!... =) And yet with all this, the question still remains, "Are we one body?" Can we take all the blessing, comfort, encouragement God has given us, and through it, become "like-minded" and "one in spirit and in purpose?"

I've said this once, and I'll say it again, I'm probably the most unlikely CBS coordinator there's ever been. When I first came as a freshman, I was "that punky kid" that none of the upperclassmen liked. I had already been serving at church and youth group since forever, and I thought I knew how my life should be. In my eyes, Cornell "owed" my happiness and fun for the 40 grand I was paying to come here. CBS "owed" me care and babying because I was a freshman. And for me, I "owed" it to myself to have the "best college experience ever" because I had always heard that college was supposed to be the best time in your life. And as a result, my attitude towards Cornell and CBS wasn't exactly the best and I could always find some reason to complain about them. At first, I didn't really click with the people. Then, none of the upperclassmen really took care of me. Next, it was the fact that my class was so "unique" and not exactly the best connected. Needless to say, my freshman year was quite a struggle, and I never really felt that sense of belonging, like I really fit in on this campus.

And for a long time, it seemed as if things would never get better. I eventually began to withdraw from CBS and just started doing "my own thing." Sure, I still went on Friday nights, lead praise and met with my prayer partner, but it seemed clear to me that unity was something that I

could never grasp. Then at the end of sophomore year, God taught me one of the most important lessons I've learned at Cornell. At the time, I was debating whether or not I should transfer out of Cornell and back to a school in California. I figured it would solve all my problems, I'd go to a place where I had friends again, where the weather was nice and the academic workload was less stressful; college would be everything it was meant to be. It all seemed so clear. But then God began to work. He used some arguing with my housemates, some lectures from my prayer partner and, most importantly, my quiet times with him, to begin breaking down all these preconceived notions of "belonging" and "fitting in." Instead, he taught me about His will and purpose, about belonging to Him and not to any group of friends or school. He taught me that my happiness wasn't about *getting all I could out of Cornell*, but it was *about letting God get all He could from me*, no matter where I was. And ever so slowly, my life began to change.

Well after 2 years, I'm not writing to tell you that being involved in CBS made all my life problems went away. On the contrary, I would say CBS has brought with it a whole new set of problems I would never have faced otherwise! Instead, what I wanted to say is this. All of us, at some point, will feel "disconnected" and misunderstood. It'll cause us to lose heart and be apathetic towards CBS and even towards our Heavenly Father. But what God has taught me is: Unity and belonging aren't about how good others make us feel or how well we can fit in. Being like-minded, as it states in Philippians, is about Love. It's about all of us, as a body, sharing one ultimate and complete Love, Jesus Christ, and then allowing Him to dictate how we treat those around us. In other words, building unity, isn't about letting everyone else make us feel welcome and comfortable, but it's about us, first going out of way to put others above ourselves, regardless of how we feel. And the only way to get over those moments where we feel the most alone and friendless, is to seize those opportunities to make others feel welcome and cared for.

So I really encourage all of you to get/stay involved in CBS. Serve somewhere, anywhere. It can be an "official position" on a ministry team or in a Bible study, or it can just be in the way you interact with other CBSers, by listening to their problems or giving them encouragement. Remember, this body of believers needs every one of you to make it run. And in those times where it seems like nobody is there for us and the fellowship is just too spread out, remember that unity isn't something that will just happen to us. It's something that can only be achieved if we work for it. It's mindset of humility. It's a life of love. So

go and live it!

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## 1 Peter Bible Study

We all suffer at one time or another. When we endure unjust suffering, it is very easy to say, "That's it, I've had it." And sometimes we succumb to that. Why does God call us to do this? In this semester's bible study on 1 Peter, I've gained many insights into this question.

Christ suffered for us, for our sins, and He didn't have to at all. He did it because He loves us. Jesus Christ is an example of someone who endured unjust suffering. "He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth. When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats" (1 Peter 2: 22-23). The apostle Peter tells us not to be surprised at painful trials, but instead to rejoice that we participate in the sufferings of Christ. Around the world, many Christians suffer persecution. In chapter 4, Peter says, "If you are insulted because of the name of Christ, you are blessed, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you." Thus, we should consider our trials as blessings, because we are able to take part in Jesus's suffering. Furthermore, through every trial, God refines us in ways beyond our imagination. God will restore us and make us strong, firm, and steadfast.

In the midst of pain, it can feel as if the suffering will last forever. However, suffering on earth is temporary like other material things in this life. God calls us to eternal things. God has something amazing in stored for us, eternal life with Him.

When we go through unjust suffering, we often get frustrated and sometimes angry

# Interviews

## **Game Theory and Movie Watching: David Zai**

Four years at Cornell have been an interesting experience for David Zai. He did many things most college students don't aspire to do, and had an interesting time doing them. Among David's quirks is his summer-long attempt to catch up on movies. During the summer of 2003, David watched 100 movies in 97 days—that's more than 1 movie a day! He was so determined, in fact, that he even had a 56 day streak, during which he did not miss a single day of movie-watching. Among his other amazing feats was his ability to go for five straight winters without wearing a winter jacket. David is one tough cookie! In addition to these crazy feats, David also enjoys pastimes such as writing—articles, journals, stories, etc.

As David looks back on the past four years, there are several things he will remember from Cornell. In terms of academics, Dave will take with him knowledge from a diverse range of classes, ranging from ECE to CS to pre-med classes. Some of his favorites have been ECE 310 (Probability and Random Phenomenon)—which he has found very useful in games and prediction—as well as CS 280 and ECE 476 (Microcontroller Design). However, one thing he does regret is the heavy course load that he chose to take on. Through it all, though, he does have some good things that he will take with him from Cornell and CBS. In CBS, David has learned a lot about fellowships—how they work, and how groups of believers from all different backgrounds can come together to worship the same God. David has always enjoyed getting to know people in CBS, especially in small group and personal contexts. He has also always enjoyed fellowship dinners and the opportunity to see the whole fellowship together. What really stands out, though, are the random road trips that he has been able to take with other CBSers to places like Syracuse, and other random places. It's through events like this that he's made some good friendships, especially with a lot of the alums, which he hopes to keep in the future.

After spending four years here, one can't help but notice the changes that CBS has undergone. David notes especially the changes that might have been caused by the North campus initiative. It seems like people hang out less than they used to, especially between classes. Also, as a result of the tightening job market, there is much more pressure to perform academically than there used to be, resulting in a gradual decrease in hang-out time. He also feels that there are less small-group opportunities to get to know people. However, many good things have emerged. For example, CBSers seem more receptive to newcomers, and evangelism and outreach—even between fellowships—have expanded in recent years.

As he reflects on his own personal life through the past four years, David has seen that not too much has changed. However, he is now more aware of where he needs to change and areas of growth for the future. As a senior, the inevitable question of the future hangs over his head. At this point, he is not sure where God is leading him in terms of career. As an ECE major, CS minor, and premed, many options lie ahead. While he sees medicine as probably the most fulfilling, he is not sure if he has what it takes for the profession. Engineering is still a possibility, and would probably be the more normal route for him to take. Nevertheless, he is open to God's will and will be trying to discern it during the coming summer.

If you would like to get to know him better after taking MOCK 101, I highly recommend you take Will's dream class with him. Here's what Will's dream class is, and what he thinks about it:

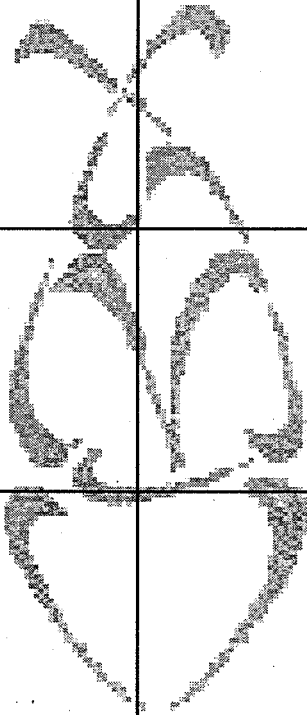

**Lab Report for CBSPR 452**

**Prayer Ministry**

**Introduction**

In order to encourage the Chinese Bible Study to grow in the prayer aspect of their Christian walk, the prayer ministry of 2003-2004 chose three aspects of prayer to focus on: honesty, faith and love, in hopes that people would be truthful and open with God, to pray with a confidence that God listens and works in accordance to His will. We also wanted to encourage brothers and sisters to live out Christ's love with each other, because love compels us to pray for one another.

**Hypothesis**

Through listserv emails and large group presentations, we hoped to bring the message across. We also hoped to encourage others as we met up with them personally, and we also tried to steer the fellowship in the aforementioned directions through carefully lead prayer meetings (WCPM and NCPM). Lastly but most importantly, we endeavored to ask our Almighty God to work in people's hearts, through our own personal prayers for the ministry.

**Methods**

We sent out a couple listserv emails and spoke to the fellowship on more than two Friday evenings, but to little avail, considering that a large number of people were too swamped with announcements and long emails already, and our messages were in one way or another, deleted. Next, we asked ourselves what areas we wanted to challenge the fellowship in, and concocted questions-of-the-week to help facilitate thinking and application of those challenges. For example, to foster honesty with each other and to encourage "tough questioning," we had prayer ministry attendees ask each other any question they wanted. Topics ranged from the status of dating relationships to lessons that people had been learning. Another time, we had attendees tell one encouraging thing about someone else, to remind each other how good it was to receive and give encouragement.

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**Analysis**

Although the efficacy of the mass emails, CBS large group announcements, and pointed questions at prayer meetings was limited, we saw how people began to grow and learn in areas related to their prayer lives. We also were very encouraged by a general increasing trend of people who made time out of their busy schedules for a weekly corporate chat with God.

**Conclusion**

As the 2003-2004 school year draws to a close, we are again relieved that God worked through us, in spite of us. Our efforts were often inadequate, and yet God still burdened CBS for prayer. He still enabled us to encourage the fellowship, and He still heard our prayers and answered them so faithfully. We recommend that you now put down your B.o.L. for a minute and praise God for His work.

# President's Letter II

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## Learning to Live, Living to Love...

That has been the vision that Wen and I have presented to CBS this year, the direction that we have felt God pushing the fellowship. But aside from us telling you these six words twice a semester, what does it practically mean? What does it mean to learn to live, what does it mean to live to love, and how do those two things play out practically in all of our lives?

So then, what does it mean to "learn to live"? Well, there are several points from which to push this phrase: we should be learning daily to live as Christians, we should be learning daily to live as students, and we should be learning daily to live out our testimonies. So then, the hard part about this is balancing all of these things. I'm not saying that I have all of these things figured out (although it's easy to assume, seeing as how I've been attempting to do that for the last four years), but it is a continuous process in learning *how* to, as well as *why*, we live.

Ultimately, the answer to why we live—albeit an easy Sunday school answer—is to glorify God. That is our primary calling and our primary concern: God's glory, His honor, and His praise. So then how does glorifying God play into learning to live? On one hand, we do not know how to glorify God, how to praise Him, except by those means which He told us. So in order for us to learn how to live, that requires that we dig into His Word, that we spend time getting to know this God, and that we spend time learning how we should glorify this God.

How does Chinese Bible Study do this? Every aspect of CBS focuses on God, on glorifying Him, on getting to know Him.

Through Bible studies, prayer meetings, prayer partnerships, Coffeehouse, and large group, we meet together so that we are able to learn how to live and what we are living for. The driving force behind CBS is God and God alone. Yes, many times it seems like we push for Bible studies and for prayer meetings on our own, out of our own desires and our own wants to see CBS "do well" and continue to "grow." However, the minute that we lose sight of God as our ultimate goal, the minute we lose the desire to glorify God, then we start to do all these things for our own motives and no longer for God. As one of the brothers in CBS has told me and often reminded me:

"It isn't about what I want...as a matter of fact if it was what I wanted, then I wouldn't be doing this, but it's about what God wants...He's the one who is going to carry me through the thick and the thin, the good times and the bad..."

So as we look at the prayer meetings, serving the fellowship, and how we are spending our God-given time, we need to ensure that the force behind it is God, that we are spending the time digging into His Word, getting to know the Lord of our lives better, and seeing what he would have us do.

What does it mean, "live to love"? It's kinda like the flip side of the previous phrase. Now that we know how to live, then the reason for living is *love*: love for those around us who do not know God, love for those around us who do know God, and especially a love for God. Several ways that this is brought out is in prayer meetings, meeting up, and Coffeehouse. Prayer meetings provide an atmosphere where we can bond together as a body of believers, lifting up one another in prayer, laying our concerns down before one another and God. The Bible calls us

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1 John 3:16 This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers.



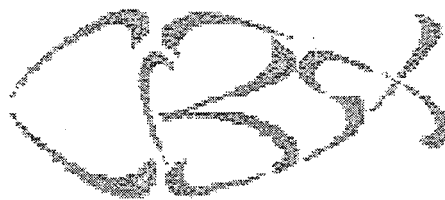
to prayer, and while we need to be spending time individually in prayer, we also need to be spending time loving our brothers and sisters in corporate prayer. But prayer meetings are not the only method of showing love and living to love one another; we also need to spend time caring, encouraging and building up those around us, both those in and those not yet in the body of Christ.

With all this stuff that we should be doing, how does this balance out with our additional call to be students on this campus? Of priority and importance is to be growing, and learning how to live and how to love those around us. Then the importance is placed on living out what we are learning. If your calling is to be a student, then praise God through your grades. But your primary calling is to glorify God and not your schoolwork. Ultimately, we need to strive and move in the areas that God is calling us, and He will provide and care for us in the other areas. Nothing supercedes our Christian walks. We need to be coming daily before Him, seeking Him out and seeking out His will for us and following His call. We need to be spending time **Learning to Live** as God wants us to and **Living to Love** where He calls us to.
